WHY

Conventional fertilizer production heavily relies on fossil fuels, causing environmental concerns. A looming phosphate shortage further highlights the need for bio-based fertilizers. However, there are barriers to the use of bio-based fertilizers, including insufficient awareness and knowledge among policymakers and stakeholders, knowledge gaps between bio-based value chains, communication challenges, poor business cases and a lack of accessible financial support.

WHAT

The training in workstream 1 provides the information needed to overcome these challenges.
